What are sight words?

Sight words are the most common words found in text. Students should be able to read sight words **automatically** and **on demand**. Unlike phonics words, we do not ask students to sound out, segment or blend sight words. Successful readers are able to recognize these words "**on sight**."

Sight Word Statistics:

- *12 Sight Words make up about 25% of those we read and write.
- *100 Sight Words make up about 50% of those we read and write.
- *About 300 Sight Words account for 75% of those we read and write


Much like teaching phonics, sight words should be taught in a consistent and sequential way. Since sight words may not follow a specific phonetic pattern of teaching, it is important that we introduce sight words early on. For example, the word "the" is one of the first sight words introduced to a child who is just beginning to learn how to read. (It appeared 3 times in the last sentence, and one time in this sentence.) However, the word "the" includes a digraph (th) (two consonants that come together to produce a different sound when combined), and a schwa at the end. Digraphs and schwas are not introduced until much later in reading, once a child is more familiar with the more basic phonics concepts. However, in order for a child to read more fluently and confidently, the word "the" MUST be introduced early on. Therefore, these words need to be taught in conjunction with phonics skills in order to build confident and fluent readers.


How do you teach sight words?


